The University of Lúrio in Mozambique has implemented an optometry training program in partnership with the International Centre for Eyecare Education (ICEE) www.icee.org and Dublin Institute of Technology (DIT), in February 2009. Interested candidates should be degree qualified (minimum Bachelor's degree in Optometry), able to speak Portuguese and have a keen interest in academia preferably with previous undergraduate teaching experience. Responsibilities will include lecturing, clinical work and supervision and/or program coordination.

Salary Package: US \$ 32 000 – US \$ 36 000 per annum depending on experience (Includes relocation and support costs such as housing, telephone allowances and healthcare)
